

Job Description: Director of Community Mobilization and Public Policy

Do you believe we will see a generation of tobacco-free youth? Do you believe that every youth deserves the right to be happy and risk-free from alcohol and other drug addiction? Are you looking for an opportunity to join a collaborative team and make a difference in the lives of our youth? If so, you're the type of candidate we hope applies for this role.

TxSDY is looking for a passionate social change leader who isn't afraid to work hard and speak up to protect youth. We are looking for someone that will inspire others to create healthier and safer communities that prevent youth substance misuse. The Community Mobilization and Public Policy Director will build and maintain meaningful relationships with community partners and identify opportunities to transform systems by harnessing collective power.

Internally, this position works closely with the Director of Programs and Strategy and our Epidemiologist. Externally, the position works with communities across the state to elevate local voices and youth substance use issues to state and local policymakers. Our Community Mobilization and Public Policy Director is expected to work at the local and state levels on movements that help communities' advance policy change, evidence-based prevention strategies, and structural reform that protects youth from substance use.

We are looking for someone who:

- Thinks about short term in relation to long term goals and the big picture
- Is resilient yet approachable
- Has worked with large and diverse volunteer groups
- Can inspire others while holding them accountable
- Has worked in public policy, public health, community organizing, or political campaigns
- Doesn't mind tackling a task first
- Is agile and able to use adaptive thinking

Essential Job Duties:

- Serves as a strategic thinker who can work independently
- Collaborates, both internally and externally, to achieve organizational goals and advance our prevention agenda
- Helps manage implementation of TxSDY's prevention agenda
- Serves as lead planner for TxSDY's Community Regional Forums
- Plays an essential role in building and managing our team of public health advocates
- Designs multi-faceted strategies including trainings/presentations to ensure timely and effective community engagement in our campaigns for social change
- Manages specific grants, ensures fulfillment of grant objectives, adheres to funder's compliance requirements and budget, meets with grant officer/s

- Strategically develops, coordinates, and oversees the implementation of capacity building efforts to generate a collective impact
- Interacts with stakeholders, coalitions, thought leaders, influencers, elected/appointed officials, agency/department heads and volunteers in politically, economically, and racially diverse communities
- Monitors public policy priorities for immediate and long-term impact
- Provides policy research, talking points, and supporting materials for policy issues
- Recruits, trains and supports volunteers and partner agencies

The ideal candidate will have:

- Bachelor's Degree in public policy, political science, public health, communications or equivalent work experience
- Track record of successfully passing public policy and grassroot organizing
- Proven track record in grant writing, and completing grant reports
- Minimum of 3 years of one or more of the following:
 - Legislative and/or regulatory advocacy
 - Volunteer organizing and/or event planning in partnership with volunteers
 - Building and managing issue-based advocacy campaigns
 - Developing and implementing grassroots tactics
 - Recruiting and developing advocates
 - Developing and implementing media advocacy campaigns
 - Producing high-quality analysis of policies and regulations as well as lay-person education resources in multiple formats
- Demonstrated ability to simultaneously manage multiple, complex projects in varying stages of development and bringing them to scale under time constraints
- Knowledge of the principles and practices of strategic planning and budgeting
- Ability and comfort using technology (e.g. Zoom, PowerPoint, Basecamp) to achieve goals
- Exceptional oral and written communication skills
- Exceptional conflict resolution and facilitation skills
- Exceptional ability to foster relationships and build powerful partnerships
- Exceptional ability to speak diplomatically with those that may not share TxSDY's sense of urgency, political beliefs, nor fully support proposed solutions
- Ability to travel overnight on a regular basis
- Cell phone, driver's license, personal vehicle with applicable insurance
- Ability to lift 30 pounds
- Small non-profit experience is highly preferred
- Commitment to organizational mission and ideology in order to effectively promote and advance the goals of our organization.
