


ALCOHOL-TO-GO LAW ENFORCEMENT AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The Alcohol-to-Go law, passed in **2021**, allows for the sale of alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption.

Texans for Safe and Drug-Free Youth (TxSDY) conducted a survey among Texas law enforcement officers to assess their awareness, training, and enforcement of the law.



City: 34 law enforcement officers.

County: 26 law enforcement officers.

ISD: 2 law enforcement officers.

State: 7 law enforcement officers.

Uncategorizable: 1 law enforcement officer.

TOTAL: 70 law Enforcement officers



Warnings

11.4% of officers reported issuing warnings, totaling **299** warnings.

Citations



529 citations were issued statewide, with **94.5%** issued by city law enforcement agencies.

Officers reported issuing a citation for violations of this law.

78.6% of officers reported being familiar with the Alcohol-to-Go law.



Only **21.4%** of the officers received formal training related to this law.



57.2% gap in training that calls for the immediate development and implementation of standardized training programs.

28.6%



expressed interest in participating in a paid key informant interview or focus group regarding the law.
