ALCOHOL-TO-GO LAW ENFORCEMENT SURVEY

The Alcohol-to-Go law, passed in 2021, allows restaurants to sell alcoholic alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption as long as the order includes a food purchase. Due to concerns that the new law would make it easier for underage drinkers to obtain alcohol, Texans for Safe and Drug-Free Youth (TxSDY) has been conducting ongoing assessments to determine the law's impact on youth access to alcohol.

In 2024, TxSDY conducted a survey among Texas law enforcement officers to better understand their awareness, training, and enforcement of the law. 70 officers at the school campus, city, county, and state levels participated in the survey.

SURVEY RESULTS



21% of the officers received formal training related to the alcohol-to-go law.



79% of the officers reported being familiar with the alcohol-to-go law.



11% of the officers reported issuing a citation for violations of the alcohol-to-go law.
